



ADVISOR JOB DESCRIPTION

The person in this role in each school should be a teacher or administrator who has a sincere and dynamic connection with the school's students. The Advisor must be willing to go the extra mile to see the students succeed, yet allow students to use their own creativity. Advisors ideally will cheer the students on as they both work hard to meet the goals of the Student Food Drive and develop leadership skills that will be used throughout life.

This person will act as a motivator and guidance counselor for the students as they learn to:

- Communicate the mission of the Student Food Drive to the entire student body
- Collect food donations
- Raise money to purchase food
- Transport food

The Advisor allows the students to learn, succeed and sometimes fail in order for the leadership component to be accomplished. The Advisor understands the role of "friendly competition" as it relates to the Student Food Drive. A successful Advisor understands the importance of the role of the Lowcountry Food Bank in the community and how the Student Food Drive relates to the experience that will build leadership and volunteerism in students.

It is the Advisor's responsibility to:

- Maintain communication with the Lowcountry Food Bank
- Oversee the students' events for the Student Food Drive
- Escort students to the Student Food Drive events at the Lowcountry Food Bank (Kick-off, Loading Day and Awards Party)
- Celebrate the efforts of the students
